How parents/carers can help

One A3 sketchbook is provided within a plastic portfolio for every GCSE Art student at the beginning of the course. It is your daughter's responsibility to keep this work safe. When transporting between home and school it should be left within the art department in individual art drawers in preparation for their lesson before morning registration.

Art students are provided with basic art equipment and can borrow materials from the department but a basic set of pencils and coloured pencils is recommended .

All lessons can be found on Teams. This can help the student to be able to recap the learning objectives set and complete the work if absent. Intervention sessions are held in the Art room at lunchtimes. This is an opportunity to complete prepwork, access specialist art materials and have individual support from their art teacher.

They will look at how organisms within ecosystems are distributed and will conduct field investigations to study the organisms in our community. They will look at how organisms can be classified in different methods put forward by various scientists.

Students will look at biodiversity and how human population growth is having a negative impact on this. They will look at way this can be managed and look ahead to help solve a future global crisis.

Genes:

Students will begin by looking at the similarities between asexual and sexual reproduction on a genetic level.
