



The school is committed to delivering the statutory RSE curriculum in an approach that is sensitive to the faiths of all our school community.

A thorough RSE Consultation was undertaken in 2020-21, an outline of which can be seen below. Following this, the school has taken additional steps to review and refine the delivery approaches. This document provides a summary of actions taken by the school:

The Consultation Process (December 2020-February 2021)

The Process:

- **15th December 2020:** A face-to-face parents meeting held at school in which the proposed policy, curriculum delivery schedule and frequently asked questions presentation were shared with parents and explained in detail.
- **17th December 2020:** to 4th January 2021: The documents and presentation were available to view online on our school website. Parents were invited to share their views by emailing the dedicated consultation email address: consultation@bggs.com.
- **10th February 2021 at 4.30pm:** The last consultation took place securely over Microsoft Teams which enabled any parents who worked during the day to attend and share feedback to the proposed schedule.

BGGs have moved it to Year 5. It is revisited again in Year 6 in both schemes. ● The topic on Body Parts is planned for Year 1 and 2 in Jigsaw and Year 2 in 'You, Me, PSHE', both schemes have visual images to share and a range of biological vocabulary. BGGs will introduce in Year 2 with a reduced

Visit to Belle Vue Girls	Secondary school leaders have visited Belle Vue and met with their leaders, and have shared good practice around the consultation process, curriculum and teaching approaches.
