

At the beginning of each year, children can nominate themselves. Nominees present to their class the reasons why they would make a good councillor. Each class votes for their councillor.



Year 7 have walked £250 miles as a group to raise money for LEPRA.

Year 8 have taken part in a £20 challenge to see how much money they can raise for different charities.

Year 9 have taken part in First Give. They researched local charities and then raised money for the most popular charity in the form. They have raised £358 in total so far.

WHAT HAVE WE DONE SO FAR?


First, the anti-bullying ambassadors came together and completed the training that was required to educate us about the different types of bullying:
