Phonics is taught daily for 20-30minutes as a whole class.

We are following the validated phonics scheme 'Essential letters and sounds'

Reading




Parent/Carer information leaflet

It means that your child can enjoy reading books that practise the exact grapheme-phoneme correspondences that they have just been taught by their teacher.
