

Classroom Activities

This week, Reception have enjoyed reading the story Whatever Next! We found space so exciting and decided to crate a space scene. We played alongside our friends, some of us pretended to be space gladiators and some of us were aliens. We have all shown Pilly Perseverance this week, whilst using tools to save animals that were frozen in ice. Our hands were so cold, but we used our shoulder and finger muscles to crack the ice and free the Arctic animals.







In Maths, we have continued with our numbers to 20. The children have practised counting forwards and backwards on a number line to 20 as well as comparing and ordering numbers to 20. In English, we have focused on our alternative version of Little Red Riding Hood and have completed a character description of Little Red. The children used many different adjectives they learnt this week to complete this piece of writing. In Science, we have started our topic on plants: children named common garden and wild plants and are eager to go out into the school grounds to explore further. In Geography, we are continuing with map work and have now improved our directional language and the use of compass points. As we are looking at traditional tales, in DT we are learning about structures and have started to look at what materials we can use to make a strong bridge for The Three Billy Goat Gruffs.

Children have settled back well after the holidays ad it has been so lovely to see them!

In English we have introduced our new class text 'Poems Aloud'. Children have been exploring poetry and emotions. They have performed a poem to an audience. In Maths children are learning about money. They have been recognising different values of money and understanding that different coins and notes can make the same amounts. In Science children have been 'sugar detectives' and recognising how much sugar are in different drinks. There were some surprising results. Please ask your children why! In DT children have been developing their understanding of food hygiene and why this is important when preparing food.

Classroom Activities

Year 3 have had a wonderful start to the term and have been very enthusiastic learning all about Rivers. We have started off reading and learning about the book 'A River', by Marc Martin! During, PSHE we had a discussion about our dreams and goals and what we aspire to be in the future and why. In Maths, we have revised over multiplication and division, where we will now be moving on to multiplying 2 digits by a 1 digit number. Lastly, we are getting ready for our River Wharfe trip, which will take place on the 7th February. Children need to remember to bring their letters back in as soon as possible.

Year 4 have been extremely busy this week researching about Ben Nevis so we can begin drafting our non-chronological reports. We have also been looking at different ways mountains are

formed whether it be fold mountains like the Himalayas or Fault Block mountains like the Sierra Nevada in the USA. In Design Technology, we have been looking at sugar content in the foods we like and thinking about healthy alternatives. This will help us make healthy choices when we make our own meals in a few weeks. Keep up the good work Year 4!



EAR 5

Year 5 have had a wonderful start to the term and have been very enthusiastic learning about all about Space. We have started off learning the names of all the planets and sang a song to help us with this! In Design Technology we have designed and decorated our cushions that we will make later on this term. During, PSHE we had a discussion about our dreams and goals and what we aspire to be in the future and why. In Maths, we have revised multiplication and division, where we did long multiplication using 4 digits by 2 as well as short division using the bus stop method.

Year 6 have started their new cross curricular topic about the First and Second World Wars and have shown themselves to be avid learners due to their questions about why the wars started and the events which took place. We have lots to cover and it's going to be a great topic! In Design Technology, they have been looking at Anderson shelters and have started working in groups to plan and create designs for their own model shelter, while considering which materials would serve the best purpose. In English, we have started reading Goodnight Mister Tom and the pupils were eager to learn about the evacuee programme and what life could have been like for them as a child during WW2.
