2. Uniform and Jewellery

As it is the beginning of the term, this presents a good opportunity to highlight the BGGS uniform policy. The wearing of the correct school uniform plays an important part in upholding the school's behaviour policy, as we believe that it promotes good behaviour and helps reinforce the high standards we expect from our pupils. I would like particularly to re-iterate our policy on jewellery. The only jewellery which is allowed is one pair of studded earrings and one nose stud. Bracelets, necklaces, and rings should not be worn.

Parents are also reminded that it is now uniform policy in the Senior and Primary Phase that if a student is wearing a white shirt that they must wear a tie. Ties can be purchased from the usual uniform retailers. We also have a small number of Senior ties available at school and these can be purchased via Parentpay. 4. Stem Big Ideas Workshop



Following on from the workshop at the end of last term, we again welcomed Solutions for the Planet and Northern Gas Networks into school to continue working on the Big Ideas Workshop with our Y9 students. In the first of a series of development sessions, students worked on producing and submitting a business plan for their product, service, or campaign. One of the mentors, Mahliqa, from @northergasnetworks, who came to support students during the session, believes "we have some very exciting ideas."

5. Jennifer Burkinshaw - Author Visit



We were delighted to welcome author Jennifer Burkinshaw into school on Tuesday who came to speak to our Year 7 pupils 7 about her debut novel Igloo - a heart-warming story set against the stunning backdrop of the French Alps.

The students listened to the first chapter of the novel, watched two book trailers, and even pitched their own new winter story. The students thoroughly enjoyed her visit and asked her lots of interesting questions. We hope to invite Jennifer back very soon to speak to other year groups in the school.

6. Mental Health Workshops

We were also delighted to welcome the teams from Healthy Minds Bradford and Craven AllStar into school as part of their First Give UK programme of workshops. Pupils from Year 8 and Year 9 participated in a workshop focused around the theme of anti-bullying.

We are also hoping to offer this workshop to Parents and Carers, which will be delivered by NHS Healthy Minds Apprentices aged 16-24. The aim of the workshop is to give parents an insight into the problems that young people face surrounding bullying and discrimination, offering parents and carers alternative solutions by way of early intervention and awareness, promoting and instilling empathy, resilience, equity, diversity, and inclusion. A date for the workshop, together with instructions on how to register, will be communicated shortly.

7. Keeping Warm Event

8. Flu and Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Flu and coronavirus (COVID-19) are circulating at high levels across the country, and it is likely this will continue in coming weeks. High numbers of scarlet fever, also continue to be reported. The government has provided the following advice for schools and parents to help minimise the spread of infection:

- If your child is unwell and has a fever, they should stay home from school until they feel better, and the fever has resolved.
- Help children to learn about the importance of good hand hygiene by practising regular handwashing at home with soap and warm water. Catching coughs and sneezes in tissues then binning them is another simple way to help stop illness from spreading.
- Adults should also try to stay home when unwell and if you do have to go out, wear a face covering. When unwell don't visit healthcare settings or visit vulnerable people unless urgent.
- Remember that Flu vaccination is still available for all eligible groups and is the best protection against the virus. Vaccination among young children remains low and getting your child vaccinated protects them and others they come into contact with. It's still not too late. Eligible children include:
 - those aged 2 and 3 on 31 August 2022
 - All primary school-aged children
 - some secondary school-aged children

9. Flu Drop In Clinic

The School Immunisation Team will be running a drop-in Flu Vaccination clinic on Saturday 21st January 2023 between 9.30am – 2.30pm at Horton Park Health Centre, 99 Horton Park Avenue, Bradford, BD7 3EG.

The Flu nasal spray and the Porcine-free flu injection will be available.

The drop-in clinic is for students that have NOT received their flu vaccination this season. Please be aware the school immunisation team are still carrying out school sessions throughout January, however if you would prefer a clinic appointment, please attend this drop-in clinic. This clinic is eligible for students in Years 7, 8 and 9.

Bradford Trampoline Club host weekly sessions at BGGS. Interested parents should book directly through the club. Please see the attached flyer for more information.


