Progress in Writing	Pupils eligible for PP in every class make accelerated progress in writing by the end of the year so that the gap between pupils eligible for PP and "other" pupils is reduced.	Sept 2021
Progress in Mathematics	Improved outcomes for pupils in receipt of PP in mathematics, especially for middle and higher attainers at KS2	Sept 2021
Phonics	Improved outcomes for pupils in receipt of PP so the gap between PP and other pupils is reduced. (44% March 2020)	Sept 2021
Other	Reduce the number of persistent absentees among pupils eligible for PP to 5% or below. Overall PP attendance improves to 96% in line with 'other' pupils.	Sept 2021

	Securing writing progress.	A programme of writing strategies will be taught and embedded. Well-kept data that is regularly reviewed through the school's tracking to discuss at Progress Meetings.
Teaching	Securing maths progress.	To work closely with Senior School staff from the Maths Department to learn from their achievements. To look at other schools and how Singapore and Dynamo Maths are impacting on progress.
Targeted support	Increasing attendance. Securing phonics intervention for early reading.	Outside agency to help the school develop strategies for parent engagement. Ensuring parents are fully informed of the link between progress and attendance. To provide Phonics and other literacy CPD for all staff in EYFS and KS1. To ensure that additional TA time from expert in Phonics is available at early stages in school.
Wider strategies	To provide a Breakfast Club for pupils. Extra provision for disadvantaged pupils involving school trips.	To provide staff who will: supervise pupils, help with homework, make breakfast, and support pupils. Provision available to subsidise day and residential trips. Opportunities for clubs, such as P.E. and music.

Review: last year's aims and outcomes

Aim	Outcome
Progress in Maths.	Improvement in PP attainment from 2019-2020. However, not currently on track to build on this in 2021.
Progress in Reading and Writing.	Steady improvements in Reading results and this will remain a priority to carry on as a focus. Writing - there has been a gradual decline in PP outcomes and will remain a priority.
Other.	As a result of the pandemic overall attendance declined when compared to previous years and slightly more so for PP pupils compared to other pupils. A focus on engaging PP pupils during continued disruption to learning.
