

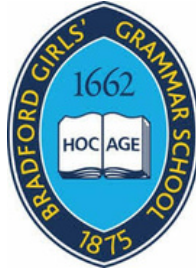

Safeguarding Notice:

Disturbing Content Related to Recent News Events

Following a recent alert issued by West Yorkshire Police, we would like to make parents and carers aware that graphic and distressing content relating to recent news events is being shared across social media and messaging platforms.

Whilst many young people would not actively seek out such material, social media algorithms can promote and recommend content based on viewing habits and engagement. As a result, upsetting content may appear in feeds, suggested posts, or group chats without being intentionally searched for.

We encourage parents and carers to speak with their children about their online activity and remind them not to view, share, comment on, or search for distressing content. If they encounter material that causes concern, they should stop viewing it and speak to a trusted adult.

Exposure to graphic content can have a significant impact on a young person's wellbeing. If your child is affected by something they have seen online, support is available through the school's pastoral and safeguarding teams.
