Y10 Speak Out Workshops

Next Tuesday 6th July, many of our Year 10 students will be attending a workshop delivered by the Speakers Trust to help teach students how to speak with increased confidence, listen more attentively and express their thoughts with greater structure, clarity and logic. This national charity works with school across the UK to help young people by building their confidence and improving their ability to express themselves verbally.

School Fundraising Challenge for Amnesty International

This week has seen Year 8 students take the fundraising challenge. Each form group were given £20 as start-up capital and competed against other forms in their year group to see who could turn a profit and raise the most money. All monies raised are to be donated to Amnesty International:

- 8B raise £133.92 by selling ice lollies and ice creams in the sunshine
- 8C raised £147.61 with a 'guess how many sweets in the jar' competition and selling sweets
- 8N raised £217.35 by selling Krispy Kreme doughnuts with the added option to 'decorate your doughnut' for an additional cost and selling bags of giant strawberry sweets.
- 8T raised £224.72 by creating a pop-up tuck shop full of sweet treats and ice-cold beverages

Congratulations to students in Form 8T who raised the most money and can now enjoy their own non-uniform day on Tuesday 6 July. The total raised by Year 8 is £723.60 and when added to the money raised by Year 7 students, £482.60 and children in Lady Royd, £325 brings it to a grand total of £1531.20.

Summer Work Experience

Due to the pandemic, the DFE have amended the statutory guidance about what needs to be included in a written report. Schools must include information about achievements, identify some strengths as well as development points. This year there is no requirement to report on outcomes or attendance. However, we still feel that it is still important for parents to have some understanding of their child's attainment based on both teacher and summative assessments. Therefore, we will continue to use the terms WTS (working towards expected standard), EXS (at expected standard) or GD (greater depth). However, these need to be viewed with caution and not used to compare progress from previous years.
