Year 6: Autumn Term 1

English

To start the year, we are going to be creating an information text which will explore the Victorians including what daily school life was like including their lessons, teachers and potential punishments!

We are then studying and commenting critically about a variety of narrative and classic Victorian poetry, which we will also recite and perform in front of our peers.

To complete the half term in English, Year 6 will be writing a short story based on an extract from the novel 'Street Child' by Berlie Doherty which tells the story of the child Jim Jarvis in Victorian London.

Maths

To begin with, we shall be revisiting and embedding Place Value knowledge and understanding as well as developing their understanding of place value in numbers up to 10 million. The children will also have the opportunity to compare and round numbers. Following on from this, we will be having a focus on the four operations of addition, subtraction, division and multiplication. We will then move on to investigate fractions. As well as reinforcing previously taught content, the children will be introduced to multiplying and dividing fractions by integers.

Curriculum Overview

Our new topic asks the question, 'Was Titus Salt good for Bradford?'. This will allow the children to develop their understanding of some important local history, whilst exploring what life would have been like during the Victorian Era. In D.T, we will be looking at structures and linking this to the Victorian era once again. In History, we will be finding out about evacuees, the Blitz and the Battle of Britain. In Geography, we will be looking at how the Blitz affected the landscape of London and invasions across Europe. In PSHE, the focus is 'Being Me in My World' which includes, identifying goals for the year, children's universal rights, choices, consequences and rewards and democracy, having a voice. In R.E, we are going to be exploring how Sikhs show commitment by studying their values and we will also be comparing beliefs and ways of life with those of other faiths.
