7. Safeguarding Update

Geek Bar (Vape Alert)

Please be aware that an increasing number of students are gaining access to Geek Bars. These vapes, that are also known as (shisha pens) can resemble highlighter pens, but have the potential be harmful to those who smoke them. It is unknown what chemical is inside them. This product contains nicotine, which is a highly addictive substance, and in some cases unknown other harmful chemicals. They appeal to young people as they advertise to have harmless flavours. We are asking parents to stay alert.



Squid Game

It has come to our attention that some of our pupils are watching 'Squid Game' on Netflix. We are concerned that the content of the series may not be age appropriate and quite disturbing for some to watch. There has also been concern around many schools that pupils are mimicking the violent scenes that are featured in the program.

We advise that you consider this and continue to monitor the programmes that your child is watching, especially Squid Game. Clips of the violent scenes are also being featured on social media platforms such as TikTok and Instagram.
