Year 1: Spring Term 2

English

In Phonics lessons we will be continuing with Phase 5 sounds and tricky words and using these throughout our English Lessons and Topic lessons.

In our Literacy lessons we will be learning the features of narrative fantasy stories and writing our own version of 'Beegu' by Alexis Deacon. We will be using exclamation marks to make our writing exciting and learning how the prefix 'un' changes the meaning of verbs and adjectives.

We will be exploring Duckworth Lane as part History lessons and will write a recount based on the experiences we had on our walk. We are also reading 'Here We Are' by Oliver Jeffers, which is all about how great Earth is; so we will be considering how brilliant our slice of the world is in Bradford.

Maths

Number

We are looking carefully at numbers to 50 and thinking about place value; partitioning numbers into tens and ones. We are practicing counting in 2s and 5s. We will be grouping objects into tens and ones before using number-lines to 50 and estimating where numbers are on them. We will continue to practice one more, and one less.

Measurement

We are learning to use language of length and height (shorter, taller, longer) and measuring using nonstandard units such as paper clips and cubes to compare before using rulers and measuring in cm.

Volume.

We will be using language such as empty, half full, full and heavy, lighter to describe mass before weighing classroom items using non-standard units like cubes on balance scales.
