Use them to help you to decide how you should improve your work during reflection time.



BGGS use the behaviour diamond, where achievement points accumulate to reward pupils and where behaviour points carry a specific sanction.

Supporting excellent behaviour

Every lesson each pupil can gain three achievement points:


- ASPIRE POINT
 - Arrive at your lesson on time
 - Bring all the required equipment
 - Correct uniform worn neatly
- SUCCEED POINT
 - Do all tasks set in the lesson
- LEAD POINT
 - Exceed expectations or produce excellent work/answers



Supporting excellent behaviour

When pupils do not demonstrate the school values, sanctions should be issued.

- C1 Verbal warning, teacher nudges pupil clearly to improve their behaviour and no points issued.
- C2 One behaviour point issued and a second chance is given.
- C3 Pupil moved in the classroom and a curriculum area lunchtime detention issued.
- C4 On call support take pupils for a time out.
 - An afterschool detention is issued.
