BGGS use the behaviour diamond, where achievement points accumulate to reward pupils and where behaviour points carry a specific sanction.

Every lesson each pupil can gain three achievement points:

#### ASPIRE POINT


- Arrive at your lesson on time

#### • LEAD POINT


Exceed expectations or produce excellent work/answers



## Supporting excellent behaviour

When pupils do not demonstrate the school values, sanctions should be issued.

- C1 Verbal warning, teacher nudges pupil clearly to improve their behaviour and no points issued.
- C2 One behaviour point issued and a second chance is given.
- C3 Pupil moved in the classroom and a lunchtime detention issued.
- On call support take pupils for a time out.
  - An afterschool detention is issued.
