# Parents Evening on EdulinkOne


You will need to log in to EduLinkOne (either on the desktop/browser version or the app).

If you cannot see Parents' Evening on the main homepage, then you should select the **More** button to view additional features that are not in view.



Next, select the **Parents' Evening** button to book Parents' Evening appointments for your child.






All Parents' Evening events for a child will appear in the Parents' Evening window. To access the booking window, **click** anywhere on the event.

If more than one child attends the school and they are attending the same event, you can select which child you are looking for by checking their name in the top slots column next to "Learner:" and book as appropriate.

Then, you will see a table of all the teachers/ subjects you can make bookings for



Next, click on a time slot to book the subject and teacher. You can add a comment here if there is something specific you would like to discuss with the teacher.





#### School 6th Form

- The day is more structured familiar to you
- Often subjects are more traditional
- Many require high grades as only A levels (& BTECs)
   are offered
- Can be hard to get in as number of places getting smaller as more 6<sup>th</sup> forms close

### Applications

- Open days up to three in the Autumn
- Applications usually online by January/February

#### 6<sup>th</sup> Form College

- Similar to school but only ages 16-19
- Not as 'different' as a FE college
- Some may offer level 2 courses (GCSE/NVQs) eg

Notre Dame but not Dixons



### 6<sup>th</sup> Form College

#### Applications

- Open Days usually 2 or 3 before end of January
- Application online by end of January



#### Further Education College





- There is a broader range of subjects on offer
- Opportunities to learn a specialist course (NVQs)
  - administration, health and social care, hospitality and tourism, business, sales, construction, engineering or manufacturing
- There are courses at level 2 (GCSEs) in case you need to retake Maths and English or other GCSEs
- Apprenticeship opportunities
- Generally a more flexible structure where you may have to self-manage.

- Apply Online all year but the sooner the better

### Apprenticeship



#### If you

- like the idea of working and earning
- want to continue to gain qualifications at the same time
- still want the opportunity to progress to university using work-based learning.



### Apprenticeship

#### But ......

- The application process can be quite challenging and you may have to apply for several vacancies.
- You often need grade 4+ in English & Maths.
- Most people starting apprenticeships are over 18.
- It is often 'who' you know not 'what' you know and you need to be very pro-active.





### Apprenticeship

#### **Applications**

- Vacancies all year round but busier from March onwards.
- Bigger companies advertise earlier from December e.g. Audi, British Gas.

### Important information

- Applying for post-16 is not like applying to a school. You must apply to each college/school separately.
- There is no catchment area.
- It's a competitive system! You will need to attend an interview.
- We will be asked for references these include behaviour (exclusions), attendance for years 10 and 11 and relationships with peers and staff.

### Important information continued

- All of these options have application processes with requirements and deadlines.
- All of these options need thorough research and a backup plan!
- Apply to at least 3 places.
- Apprenticeships are unpredictable so apply for a place at college as well.
- Check all websites for the most up to date information on open days and applications, entry requirements etc.

### Predicted grades

- Predicted grades will be available in the week after October half term. Staff will be guided by assessments taken in June 2022 and other assessments since the start of the year.
- Staff will review and amend the grades as necessary after your mocks in December and again following the second mock exam session (core subjects) at the end of April.
- Do not make up your predicted grade as we have to verify them with the college. If we have to change them, it will not reflect well on you.
